Good-bye "Alleluia"

Throughout Lent, we do not say or sing "Alleluia" in our worship service. This is to remind us that we are in exile from our joyful home in heaven.

An old Lenten tradition is to "bury" the Alleluia. During the end of our worship service for the Transfiguration of our Lord, on March 2, the Alleluia banner is removed from the podium and placed in a casket. On Easter Sunday, it will be unfurled in a joyful celebration and displayed once again.

Note, too, that our sung responses disappear and become spoken to remind us of the solemnity of the season.

In our current study of The Minor Prophets, we will take a peek at each of the twelve books that are often forgotten or neglected. Yet, their messages are deeply relevant for today's believer. The prophetical books contain God's call upon His followers of every century – calls to positive actions that honor God or warnings to stop attitudes and behaviors that dishonor Him.

As we read and study these profound words, we will be reminded of what it means to follow and obey God, as well as be challenged to live a life that glorifies God.

From the Music Director

I see people die frequently at Magnolia Manor. Typically they are surrounded by their loved ones who help them and bring them peace as their physical bodies shut down. I often think, however, about those folks who don't have anyone by their side as they take their last breath.

I am reminded of one of these folks whom I recently sat with as she died. She had no living relatives, no one from her church visited, and no one called about her. I met her very soon after my employment began and because of her feisty spirit, I was drawn to her and we became friends. She was 99 years old. A few days before she died, I would enter her room, have a prayer with her, talk to her, and let her know that she was loved by me, but most especially by God. I never knew where she attended church, if she attended church, or what denomination with which she was affiliated, but she knew God. She couldn't speak in her last days, but was able to shake or nod her head in response to my questions. As that time grew more eminently near, I would hold her hands as I spoke with her and each time I would get up to leave, she would squeeze my hands tightly as to tell me to stay a little longer. In her last days......I would.

The ministry of touch is so important; it allows us to connect more deeply with others when we shake their hand, give them a hug, or hold their hand at their bedside. Scripture is littered with examples of Jesus' healing.....through touch. I am convinced, in her case, that through that touch she found peace, she felt love, and she knew God's merciful healing.

She died holding my hand as I was reciting Psalm 23, and as I felt her 'squeeze' release as she took her last breath, I knew that where my ministry ended, God's had taken over.

We never know the circumstances of someone else's life unless they share it with us. We never know their needs unless they communicate them to us; but what we can do, in the midst of someone's suffering, is offer them a hand as it communicates God's peace. We do it every Sunday during the sharing of the peace as a way of offering reconciliation. I would encourage you to find someone this Sunday whom you may think needs God's healing touch through you and offer that person your healing hand......and if you think they could really use it......give it a squeeze and hold it tightly!

Lord of Life prepares and serves a bagged lunch each month on the second Thursday of the month. This month service will be on March13.



He said, As Evangelism is the bringing of community into our church, Social Ministry is our church going out into the community. This helped me grasp the mission and after 5 years of faithfully chairing Social Ministry, a replacement needs to be found before council elections in June.

If you have a heart for working with people who know their jobs, and do them faithfully, find new ideas that bring members together in a focused cause, organize dates and time for everyone to come together, and write articles to keep all informed of what's going on, then Social Ministry is for you. I have worked with wonderful people who have continued to lead Sparrows Nest, Seafarers, and Operation Christmas Child. We made it through a pandemic with a toilet paper drive (started February 2020. Who knew), packed care bags full of treats and positive notes for Southeast Georgia Hospital Nurses break rooms, Magnolia Manor staff, and the hospital in Jessup. Collected fresh produce and meats for Sparrows Nest during Advent and Lent. Made people write down their acts of service and create a visual of the gifts they shared. Collected school supplies, backpacks, water bottles, socks, and underwear, then delivered them to Altama, Goodyear, and Burroughs-Molette elementary schools. And YOU did it all with a smile and giving heart.

A Note from the Endowment Fund Committee

I have discovered that many members of this congregation are not aware of the Endowment Fund and how we get our funds for the year and how the funds are distributed. The Endowment funds are calculated as either 5% of the current balance of the fund or the interest from the past year whichever is the smaller amount. This year the interest was \$10,600.00 which equates to \$2,650.00 per each quarter that can be given to a charitable organization.

The fund grows starting with us, the members of Lord of Life, by identifying a percentage of our weekly or monthly giving to go to the Endowment Fund. The fund also grows through memorials, gifts in honor of someone, stocks and bonds, annuities, sale of property and yearend tax-deductible gifts. As we grow this fund, so does our opportunity to give away more. Think what it would be like to double, triple or quadruple the amount of money we could give to charity.

Think about a charity that would benefit by you just filling out a simple grant request form. You can obtain the request form either from the office or download it off the Lord of Life website. The request form must be submitted by the 15th of the second month of each quarter (i.e., first quarter 15 February, second quarter 15 May, third quarter 15 August, and fourth quarter 15 November). Once completed the form should be placed in the Endowment Fund Committee mailbox located outside of Pastor's office.
