


# **Crafty Christmas Cottage Contest**

#### **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD**

Operation Christmas Child (OCC) National Collection Week

OCC National Collection Week is completed once again! Alleluia! This was Lord of Life's 10<sup>th</sup> year serving as a Central Drop-Off. Our church was blessed by many individuals, groups and churches from our local community throughout the week as they came to drop off their shoeboxes. As always, there were ample volunteers that joined in the fellowship hall throughout the week, 42 to be exact. Because of all the volunteers, this week was a success! Numerous stories were shared by individuals dropping off shoeboxes telling us how much fun they had shopping and packing their shoebox.

Lord of Life received 1,894 shoeboxes throughout the week (114 from our church family). Along with the other three Drop-Off Centers; Altamaha Baptist Church, Jesup; First Baptist Church of St. Mary's, St. Mary's; and CenterPoint Church, Brunswick, we shipped 447 cartons (6,669 shoeboxes) via two 28-foot trailers to the Samaritan Purse Processing Center in Atlanta on Tuesday, November 26<sup>th</sup>. That is 246 more shoeboxes than in 2023. After they are processed, they will then be sent all over the world and 6,669 children will receive a gift filled with love and also be given the opportunity to learn about Jesus in hopes of a new spiritual relationship.

A big thank you to everyone who participated with Operation Christmas Child! If you volunteered, packed a shoebox or simply prayed, you were involved. Once again, the community effort and spirit involved in this ministry became contagious as the week progressed. This ministry builds community within and outside our church walls. When was the last time you had an opportunity to participate in affecting 6,669 lives? Please continue praying for this ministry and the millions of children touched by it.
